Working in Hot Environments



We all remember the famous Wendy's commercial from the 80s of the little old lady picking up the hamburger bun and screeching, "Where's the beef?" fast forward several decades, and the same exasperation is felt when discussing TDOT and where are the projects!

\$3 billion was released from the General Assembly to the general funds for TDOT and TDOT released it's 15 billion, 10 year plan in December, the industry got excited believing that we had a lot of work coming our way. However, the money is spread over 10 years and there are several factors that impact the flow of these projects.



Wendy's commercial from 1984 "Where's the beef?"

- Inflation: Projects were estimated at 3% 4% inflation and it has gone up 11% so the funds automatically get a little tighter
 - Flow of Projects: TDOT has delivered 90% of the projected projects in the last two years of the three year plan.
- In years past if a project was listed for construction and for some reason did not go to construction those funds were reallocated to other projects but with the 90% completion rate there are less projects not getting completed therefore less projects to be funded through reallocation.



TDOT has indicated that the size of the projects will be bigger therefore:





The \$3 billion = \$750 million per region and when you spread that over a 10 year time frame and when a third of it is set-aside for projects that could take years to happen, it's not as big as we thought.



TDOT let a record \$1.7 billion go in 2023 and anticipate letting another \$1.7 go in 2024. Stay tuned for more update from TDOT for our NUCA East TN Members later this fall.



TDOT's 10 Year Plan










TMA Expanditures by Year (\$M)



Traditional Fed/State + TMA (\$M) (ever not include statemide program spending)



URBAN CONGESTION PROJECTS

Knoxville Interstate 40 (I-40) Corridor Priority Investment MAP LOCATION: SA-1

MAP LOCATION: SA-1

The area where I-40 and I-75 are joined from the I-75 interchange to the SR 158 interchange is one of the most heavily traversed areas of Tennessee. TOOT has engaged in Traffic and Revenue studies and has been meeting with private sector partners to determine the feasibility of Choice Lanes on this corridor. At this time, after consultation with industry, the construction of additional lanes in partnership with the private sector would require a significant public contribution. To ensure taxpayers receive the most transportation benefits for their investment, TDOT will continue conversations with the industry to determine interest. Should there not be any interest, TDOT will engage in a traditional state funded expansion in the years to come.

By adding capacity to this heavily traveled roadway, operations are expected to improve in this major growth area. Choice Lanes provide another option for motorists to bypass congestion allowing motor to maintain consistent travel times. The Choice Lanes would be new, optional lanes designed, built, financed, operated and maintained by a private-sector partner through a Public-Private Partnership.

Additional Urban Congestion Projects

- Blount State Route 162 Extension: Extends Pellissippi Parkway and completes the SR 33 interchange
 Blount State Route 115 (Alcoa Highway) Relocation: Will complete a significant investment over a number of years
- Anderson State Route 170 Widening Section 1: Intended to improve travel time reliability and reduce crashes

Loudon Interstate (I-75) Widening

At least one rural interstate widening was prioritized for each TDOT region. For Region 1, the Loudon interstate 75 Wifeling, an IMPROVE Act project, is receiving TMA funds to advance due to the safety enhancements and crash reductions the project would bring. Additionally, the project will help address congestion on this important rural interstate and support growing truck volume.



URBAN CONGESTION PROJECTS

Chattanooga Interstate 24 (I-24) Corridor Priority Investment

PROJECT HIGHLIGHTS

REGION

Chattanooga is one of the urban areas TDOT assessed in initial congestion studies to determine the financial viability of adding Choice Lanes. Traffic on I-24 in the Chattanooga region and anticipated growth indicate this corridor may be suitable for private investment in the future. TDOT has commissioned



private investment in the future. TDOT has commissioned Traffic and Revenue studies and is conversing with private-sector partners to further investigate the feasibility of Choice Lanes on this corridor. At this time, after consultation with industry, the construction of additional lanes in partnership with the private sector would require a significant public contribution. To ensure taxpayers receive most transportation benefits for their investment, TDOT has set aside funding for further studies continue private sector conversations annually to determine interest. Should there not be any into TDOT will engage in a traditional state-funded expansion in the years to come.

By adding capacity to this heavily traveled roadway, operations are expected to improve in this major growth area. Choice Lanes provide another option for motorists to bypass congestion allowing notorists to maintain consistent travel times. The Choice Lanes would be new, optional lanes designed, built, financed, operated and maintained by a private-sector partner through a Public-Private Partnership.

- Hamilton State Route 317 Widening: Improves safety, reduce crashes and improve the level of service on Bonny Oaks Drive
- imilton interstate 24 Widening from East of Brown's Ferry to US-27: Provides safety hancements, greater travel time reliability and more capacity for growing truck volume through the occasin Bend segment of 1-24.

RURAL INTERSTATE WIDENING

Putnam Interstate 40 Widening

MAP LOCATION: R2-7

At least one rural interstate widening was prioritized for each TDOT region. For Region 2, TDOT will add a truck climbing lane on I-40, in the area of Monterey Mountain. This is a project that was identified as part of our statewide interstate corridor studies. It will add capacity, address safety concerns, and serve freight movement to a section of rural interstate that can be difficult for trucks to navigate.




Widening I-75 in Hamilton and Bradley counties from north of SR 2 to near SR 311

PLAs - Bad Public Policy Continued:

These PLA mandates and preferences discourage experienced contractors and their nonunion employees from competing for taxpayer-funded contracts and hinder the rebuilding of their communities.

It is estimated that PLAs will unnecessarily increase the construction costs by up to 20% and result in fewer infrastructure projects and jobs created by the federal investing in America's roads, bridges, schools, and water & energy infrastructure.

Our industry members must take a proactive role in this advocacy. We would like you to contact your local U.S. House of Representatives and U.S. Senate lawmakers and let them know about any solutions that will work.

• The Fair and Open Competition Act (FOCA), H.R. 1209/S. 537 FOCA protects federal and federally assisted construction contracts from government PLA mandates and preferences, allowing merit shop contractors a fair chance at competing to rebuild America.

The Congressional Review Act resolution of disapproval, H.J. Res. 132 nullifies the Biden administration's PLA final rule on federal construction projects. It helps create a level playing field for contractors bidding on taxpayer-funded projects, encouraging competition from all qualified contractors, including small and minority-owned businesses.






